I. Eligibility

Nursing involves the provision of direct care for individuals and is characterized by the application of verified knowledge in the skillful performance of nursing functions. Anyone who makes application to the college as a degree-seeking student may apply to the Seattle Central College Associate Degree Nursing Program. Admission to the program is open to all qualified students regardless of economic or social status and without discrimination on the basis of race, color, sex, marital status, beliefs, age, national origin or disability.

All applicants for the nursing program should possess:

1. Sufficient visual acuity, i.e. to accurately prepare and administer medication and to participate in the observation necessary for client assessment and nursing care;
2. Sufficient auditory perception to receive verbal communication from patients and members of the health care team as well as to assess the health needs of people through the use of monitoring devices such as cardiac monitors, stethoscopes, IV infusion pumps, dopplers, fire alarms, etc.;
3. Sufficient gross and fine motor coordination to respond promptly and to implement the skills, including the manipulation of equipment, required in meeting health needs;
4. Sufficient communication skills (speech, reading and writing) to interact with individuals and to communicate their needs promptly and effectively as may be necessary in the individual's interest;
5. Sufficient intellectual and emotional functions to plan and implement care for individuals;
6. The ability to lift and/or move up to 50 pounds, and;
7. The ability to be on feet for 8-12 hour clinical.

II. Commitment

The Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) Program is a vigorous and intense program of study. Success in the program requires major commitment to make studying a priority. Study outside of class is a requirement as well as practice time for nursing skills. Working more than 20 hours per week is discouraged due to the time requirements in the program. Students need to have good time management skills as well as assistance with childcare and finances.

Additional Program Admission Requirements

- Successfully complete a Nursing Assistant Certified (NAC) Program; obtain a valid/active Washington State Nursing Assistant Certification (NAC) prior to application.
- Complete the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) within 18 months prior to the application date. An Overall Adjusted Individual Total Score of 75% or higher must be achieved.
- Attend a mandatory nursing information session prior to applying.
- Have your transcripts evaluated prior to applying if you have taken classes outside of Seattle Central College. Send your official transcripts to SCC Admissions and submit an Incoming Transcript Evaluation Request Form to Registration. This form can be found here: <http://www.seattlecentral.edu/forms/workforce-evaluation-form-B-191.pdf> . This process takes 6-8 weeks to complete. Verification of completed transcript evaluation must be uploaded with the application.

Corequisite Requirements

These classes must be completed prior to entering the sixth quarter of the ADN program, but *do not* have to be complete at the time of application.

Notes:

1. A minimum grade of 2.5 is required for all prerequisite and corequisite courses.
2. All math and science courses must be completed within five years of the application date. English and Psychology do not have time limits.
3. Prerequisite and corequisite courses may only be repeated twice within 5 years prior to application date.
4. Advising: After you have completed the general Seattle Central Admissions process and received your transcript evaluation results, you can contact any Academic Advisor in our Advising and Transfer Center room 1102, at advisorcentral@seattlecolleges.edu or by calling (206) 934-4068 for pre-nursing course planning and to review the transcript evaluation.
5. All admission requirements must be met prior to submitting the nursing application. See the Nursing Program Requirements Worksheet for a checklist of requirements.

IV. Application and Selection Criteria

Students are accepted by a lottery of applicants who have completed all program admission requirements by the application submission deadline. Applications are accepted twice every year in April for entrance into the fall cohort and in September for entrance into the winter cohort. Application dates will be posted on the Seattle Central College nursing website.

V. Admission Procedure

Only students with completed online applications will be considered for admission to the Seattle Central College (SCC) Nursing Program. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that all requirements are met and all required documents are uploaded in the nursing application for admission.

VI. Post-Admittance Requirements Prior to First NURS Course

After acceptance for admission and before beginning NURS courses, students are required to:

- Provide documentation of the following immunization/titer requirements:
 - Two-Step TB skin test **OR** TB IGRA (Quantiferon or TSpot) **OR** Negative Chest X-ray
 - Three Hepatitis B vaccinations **AND** a positive/immune titer
 - Two MMR vaccinations **OR** positive/immune titers for each disease
 - Two Varicella vaccinations **OR** a positive/immune titer
 - Tetanus/Diphtheria/Pertussis (Tdap) vaccination
- Provide proof an American Heart Association BLS Provider CPR card
- Provide proof of current personal health insurance
- Complete a National and State Background Check
- Complete required education modules provided by the SCC Nursing Department

VII. Re-Application Policy

If an applicant is not accepted into the program and wishes to reapply during a different admission cycle, the applicant must attend a Nursing Information Session and resubmit a nursing application by the desired admission cycle deadline to be considered. All program requirements must be satisfied prior to submission of the nursing application.

VIII. Re-Admission Policy

Students may seek re-entry into quarters 2-6. This re-entry and return policy refers to any students seeking to return to the ADN program. Students seeking re-entry into the ADN Program must meet the following eligibility criteria:

1. Complete the final clinical evaluation conferences or core courses.
2. Submit a letter of request to return stating courses needed and the intended quarter/year of re-entry. Submit the letter to the Associate Dean of Nursing a minimum of one (1) quarter in advance of quarter requested for return.
3. Return to the program within the designated time limit (1 year).
4. Successfully complete any required courses prior to the return quarter and meet the same academic standards as current students.
5. A student may be re-admitted once to the program.
6. Submit a letter to the Re-Entry Committee (ADN Nursing full-time faculty) stating:
 - a. Student's potential ability to benefit from re-entrance
 - b. Specific strategies developed for success
7. If a lapse in program attendance of more than 1 quarter occurs, students seeking re-entry must successfully pass **both** a comprehensive written and skills exam.
 - a. The written comprehensive exam will include questions from all previous nursing program classes up to and not including the quarter failed. The content of the

comprehensive exam and number of questions will be determined by the Dean of Nursing with faculty input.

- b. The skills portion will be a demonstration of skills with a faculty evaluation. Any skills learned during previous quarters, not inclusive of the quarter the student failed, may be used per faculty decision.
8. Readmission to the program is dependent upon:
- a. Successful passing of written and skills exam, if needed.
 - b. Recommendation by Re-Entry Committee.
 - c. Available space in the Nursing Program.

IX. Americans with Disabilities Act/Discrimination

Policy of Non-Discrimination on the Basis of Disability

Seattle Central College does not discriminate on the basis of disability in the admission or access to, or treatment or employment in, its programs and activities. Requirements essential to the program of instruction or related to licensing requirements, however, are not regarded as discriminatory.

Students with documented disabilities may receive accommodations under the American with Disabilities Act. Disability Support Services is located in room BE1112. Students requesting support are asked to meet with the counselor from this office to make academic arrangements.

X. Program Criminal Background Check

The Nursing Program at Seattle Central College requires students to obtain criminal background checks through American Data Bank (ADB). The background check is to ensure a safe clinical environment for both students and the public and to meet the contractual requirements of area healthcare facilities. Clinical facilities may request additional background checks.

Seattle Central College has established a background check procedure, which will be provided upon acceptance. Students who fail to submit a background check cannot complete or maintain enrollment in the Nursing Program.
