

BAS in Allied Health Respiratory Care Track

Seattle Central College's Respiratory Care track is a full-time, face-to-face, rigorous bachelor's degree program that combines classroom training with practical, hands-on experience. This program will prepare you to become a member of a dedicated healthcare team that treats patients with cardiopulmonary disorders.

How long is the program?

After you have completed the pre-requisites (about two years of work), the Respiratory Care track is 1 part-time quarter plus 7 full-time quarters (two more years) after which you graduate with a Bachelor of Applied Science and are ready to apply for a license as a Respiratory Therapist.

How do I apply?

The online application for the next Respiratory Care BAS cohort starting in the Summer will be open from **Fall Quarter through Spring Quarter**. If you want to join the next cohort in **Summer** apply here: https://apply.seattlecolleges.edu/respiratorycare

The minimum required documentation for applying:

- Unofficial transcripts showing successful completion of pre-requisites with a 2.0 or higher.
- A full report for your TEAS scores, including composite score and all four subscores
- A plan for completing your pre-requisites before or during the first quarter in Summer.⁺

The program starts each Summer (part-time) and continues in Fall with 7 full-time quarters to graduate with a BAS in Spring. Use the pre-requisite worksheet to help you plan your pathway to becoming an RT!
