**Associate of Applied Science-Transfer (AAS-T) in Allied Health: Generalist Track**  
**Dental Assistant Pathway**

This pathway is perfect for Seattle Central DA graduates who want to enhance their career opportunities by earning a college degree, the AAS-T in Allied Health: Generalist degree.

It is an ideal pathway for students wishing to earn their applied bachelor degree at Seattle Central. Students can use this pathway to help meet the academic entrance requirements for the following tracks of the Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) in Allied Health degree:

- Community Health & Education
- Healthcare Services Management

**DENTAL ASSISTING CERTIFICATE (60 credits)**

- Students fulfill this section using the credits earned by completing the DA certificate from Seattle Central.
- The DA credits may show up as a “block” of 60 credits on the Seattle Central degree audit.

**GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES (30 credits)**

- 20 credits of specific required courses, plus 10 additional credits chosen from the courses tagged as fulfilling the AA degree “Areas of Knowledge” requirements (marked as VLPA, ICS, or NW in the online course schedule).
- Students wishing to apply to a BAS in Allied Health program after completing the AAS-T degree should consider taking ENGL& 102 and a natural world (NW) class like HEA 125 as the “additional VLPA, ICS, or NW” courses.
- MATH& 146 or MATH 136 must have been taken within the past five (5) years.

Additional VLPA, ICS, or NW course (suggested: ENGL& 102)	5
Additional VLPA, ICS, or NW course (suggested: NW class like HEA 125)	5

**Notes:**

- The AAS-T in Allied Health: Generalist degree requires the completion of at least 90 applicable credits, including transferred-in credits, with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0.
- Up to a maximum of 15 credits may have course grades between 1.5 and 2.0; all other courses must be at least 2.0. No course with a grade under 2.0 will transfer into the BAS in Allied Health degree.
- All courses applied must be numbered 100 or above.
- Students must have earned their DA certificate from Seattle Central or SVI for this pathway.
- If the certificate was earned longer than five (5) years ago, the student must have been employed in healthcare for at least one (1) year within the past five (5) years.
- At least 15 credits must be earned from Seattle Central College.
- Students should apply for graduation one quarter prior to the anticipated graduation date.
- AAS-T degree completion does not guarantee admission to a BAS degree, university, or major program.
